KENNETH M. CORRELL, O-747169, First Lieutenant, Army Air Forces, United States Army. For meritorious achievement, while serving as Pilot of a B-24 aircraft on a bombing mission to Germany, 29 June 1944. Over the target a flak hit started a fire in the pilot's cabin which threatened to ignite escaping gasoline and destroy the aircraft. With full knowledge of the danger involved, Lieutenant Correll beat out the flames with his gloved hands and then skillfully flew his damaged aircraft safely back to base without further damage or injury to the crew. The courage, coolness, and devotion to duty displayed by Lieutenant Correll on this occasion reflect the highest credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.
