RAYMOND J. WILSON, 13145921, Technical Sergeant, 388th Bombardment Group, (H), Army Air (Forces, United States Army. For extraordinary achievement while serving as radio operator gunner on many high altitude heavy bombardment missions, against the enemy over Continental Europe, during a period ending 1 January 1945. By expertly operating his radio equipment during long hours of combat and by warding off vicious fighter attacks with his gun, Sergeant Wilson made a substantial contribution to the success of these operations.
