1. Data.

- a. Date of Mission 18 April 1944.
- b. Primary Targets -

14th and 96th Combat Wings - Brandenburg - Visual. 2nd and 20th Combat Wings - Rathenow - Visual.

c. Secondary Target -

All Combat Wings - Berlin - Center of City - PFF.

d. Last Resort Target -

Brandenburg - PFF.

- e. Units Participating -
 - "A" 14th CBW (392nd, 44th BG). 96th CBW (458th, 467th BG). 2nd CBW (445th, 453rd BG). 20th CBW (446th, 93rd BG).

a. Eleven Groups from four Combat Wings dispatched 272 aircraft to visually attack targets at Brandenburg and Rathenow, Germany. Fighter escort was provided by three Groups of P-47s, three Groups of P-51s, and two Squadrons of RAF Mustangs.

b. Assemblies were accomplished without incident and the Division departed the English coast on time and on course. Routes and times to the Combat Wing IP were flown as briefed, and the Division was in good order. After uncovering at the Combat Wing IP, all Groups noticed a cloud bank in the target area at their altitude, but could see the target plainly and believed they would be able to bomb before the clouds interfered. The 20th and 2nd Combat Wings, bombing Rathenow the northern target, were able to drop before hitting the cloud deck, and by making a sharp turn immediately after bombing were able to rally properly. The 14th and 96th Combat Wings, assigned to Brandenbas the southern target, were engulfed in clouds approximately one minute before "bombs away", and both Wings split up. Some pilots report being on instruments for over five minutes before coming out of this cloud bank. The Groups reformed and picked up targets of opportunity on the return route.

c. The 20th and 2nd Combat Wings, with the exception of the 446th Group and one Squadron of the 389th Group, bombed Rathenow with fair results. The 446th Group and one Squadron of the 389th Group could not pick up the primary because of clouds and contrails and bombed Doberitz with poor results. The heavy cloud layer over the target prevented the bulk of the 14th and 96th Combat Wings from bombing. The 467th Bomb Group and one Squadron of the 466th Bomb Group attacked the target with unobserved results.

using check points prior to the target in calculating release point. The remaining Groups attacked targets of opportunity at Salzenedel, Wittenberg, Saltan, Cuxhaven and Rathenow with fair results.

d. Flak was meager to moderate and inaccurate enroute with moderate and accurate gunfire in the target area. Fighter support was excellent and only seven enemy fighters were seen. Two aircraft were lost to unknown causes and there were no claims.



- a. The assigned rimary targets for this visual mission were Rathenow and Brandenburg.
- b. Branderburg was attacked by a Group and one Squadron. Rathenow was attacked by four Groups and by two Squadrons. One Group attacked Summaven and various other targets of opportunity due to weather conditions at the primary. Another Group attacked Rathenow and targets of opportunity due to weather conditions at their primary of Brandenburg. Deberitz was attacked by a Group and a Squadrom that encountered clouds at the primary. One Group attacked Wittenburge and various other targets of opportunity due to undercast at the primary. Saltau was also attacked by a Squadron that could not bomb the primary because of clouds.
- c. 2 A/C failed to borb due to battle damage. A deputy lead A/C that had taken over the lead had the bombsight freeze during the last 30 sec, of the rur and bombing was accomplished by a fixed angle approximation. One A/C had an accidental release when bomb doors were opened.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

- a. (1) Neither the 448th Group nor the 93rd Group encountered any An fire at Rathenow, but the 446th Group encountered meager and fairly accurate predictor control fire during their banbing run. Four red parachute flares were seen in the target area.
 - (2) Neither the 445th Group nor the 453rd Group encountered any AA fire at Rathenow, but the 389th Group encountered very meager and inaccurate gunfire during their bombing run.
 - (3) Neither the 392nd Group nor the 44th Group encountered any AA fire at Rathenow.
 - (4) The 466th Group encountered moderate and fairly accurate gunfire at Brandenburg which appeared to commence in the form of a predicted concentration and then continued in the form of a fixed barrage. The 467th Group made their bmbing run at the same time and were not engaged. The 458th Group were engaged by both predictor control fire and also a fixed barrage of fair accuracy.
 - (5) Various types of rockets were seen at both targets, and scarecrow flares were seen at Werben.
 - (6) Moderate gunfire was encountered on route at Cuxhaven, Nordholz A/F, Lubeck, Meldorf, Stade, Wesermunde, Itzehoe, Neuhaus and Wenzendorf A/F.
 - (7) Meager gunfire was encountered on route at Luchow, Elmshorn and from ships between Scharhorn and Heligoland.
 - (8) Balloons were seen at Wittenberge (53°00'N 11°45'E).

b. Phenomena.

(1) At Cuxhaven AA fire bursts were seen which emitted red objects which appeared to burst again.

5. Communications.

- a. Channels.
 - (1) W/T and VHF R/T channels were satisfactory. Some interference was experienced on the Division W/T channel.
- b. Navigational Aids.
 - (1) GEE operated satisfactorily. Jamming was experienced from enemy coast inland. Six A/C obtained seven fixes from assigned MF D/F section.
- c. Equipment Failures and Performance.
 - (1) Equipment reported unserviceable in part or in whole was the following: WHF (8), Command set R/T MF (2), Liaison W/T (5). Interphone (31), Compass (3), GEE (2).
- d. Radar and Radio Countermeasures.
 - (1) All M/C carried 480 units of "Window" chaff for discharing in target area.
- e. Pathfinder Equipment and Performance.
 - (1) H2X equipped A/C from 564 3qdn were assigned to fly as follows: two with the 445th BG, two with the 392nd BG, two with the 458th BB, and one with the 446th BG. Landmarks were recognizable with fair to excellent recognition. Bombing was done visually.


