1. Data.

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- a. Date of Mission 23 May 1944
- b. Primary Targets:

Avord Airdrome Lourges A/C Factory Orleans-Bricy A/D

c. Secondary Targets:

Chateaudun Airdrome Orleans-Bricy Airdrome

d. Last Resort Target - Any airdrome in occupied territory not adjacent to built-up area.

e. Units Participating - 14th CBW (44th, 392nd, 492nd BG) 96th CBW (467th, 458th, 466th BG) 2nd CBW (389th, 453rd, 445th BG) 20th CEW (448th, 446th, 93rd BG)

2. Narrative.

a. 351 aircraft were dispatched by four Combat Wings to visually attack the Avord A/D, Bourges A/C Factory and Orleans-Bricy A/D. Four Groups of P-47's, two Groups of P-51's and two Groups of P-38's furnished fighter support.

b. Assemblies were accomplished satisfactorily with the exception of interference from a B-17 Wing, resulting in the loss of one aircraft due to collision. Over the English coast, formations of B-17's crossed through the 14th Combat Wing, which was leading the Division, causing delay but not disrupting the formation. Routes were flown generally as planned with formations approximately eight minutes late at all Control Points.

c. All primary targets mere attacked visually. The Avord A/D was heavily damaged with hits in hangars, workshops, stores, administrative buildings and barracks. The Bourges A/C Factory was attacked with good results with hits in assembly shop, dispersal areas and flight hangar of the factory. Very good bombing was done on the Orleans-Bricy A/D with good concentration of bombs on hangars, ammunition dump, dispersal areas and airdrome buildings.

d. No anti-aircraft fire was encountered at Bourges A/C F.ctory. At the Orleans-Bricy A/D, flak was measure and inaccurate. Moderate and fairly accurate control gunfire was encountered from Avord A/D. On withdrawal, flak was moderate and accurate at Chateaudon. One aircraft was lost in the target area, when a bomb bay door swang free, lodging on the tail surface and the aircraft spun to the ground. Cleans or nal. Friendly fighter support was good.

1. The assigned primary targets for this mission were Avord L/D, Bourges L/D, and Orleans/Ericy L/D.

 Avord A/D was attacked by three groups bombing in squadron formation. Bourges A/D was attacked by three groups bombing by squadrons and Orleans/Bricy A/D was attacked by six groups bombing by squadrons.

3. One A/C did not bomb due to a rack malfunction. The deputy lead of one group had an accidental release before reaching the target and 2 A/C dropped on this release. One A/C bombed an A/D at Chartres, France.

4. The results of bombing at Avord A/D were good, at Eourges A/D the results were good, and at Orleans/Ericy A/D the results were good.

3. Anti-aircraft Fire.

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- a. Orleans/Bricy A/F
 - (1) Sin Squadrons of the 2nd Combat Win, attacked Orleans/Bricy A/F within three minutes, and only two Squadrons encountered meager and inaccurate predictor control fire, the other formations not being engaged. Four minutes later six Squadrons of the 20th Combat Wing attacked this target within three minutes, and on this occasion only the lowest Squadron encountered meager and inaccurate predictor control fire, the other formations not being engaged. Crews estimated that there was only one 4 gun battery in the target area.
- b. Bourges A/F
 - (1) No AA fire was encountered at Bourges A/F.
- c. Avord A/F
 - (1) Meager to moderate and fairly accurate predictor control fire was encountered by all formations at Avord A/F. Gun sites were reported North, West, and South of the airfield, which generally confirmed the photographic cover of this area.
- d. Moderate and fairly accurate predictor control fire was encountered at Chateaudun. Gun sites were reported North of the town near the railway, and also near a wood South of the airfield. These reports also appear to confirm the photographic cover of this area.
- e. A balloon barrage was observed around a dam at 46°38'N, 01°08'E.
- f. Comment of Anti-aircraft Officer.
 - The attack on Orleans/Bricy A/F was a good example of the advantage obtained in saturating the defenses by means of a concentrated attack carried out in the shortest time possible.
 - (2) A number of gun sites were pinpointed by crews during this operation, the majority of which coincided very closely with positions already confirmed by photographic cover. This is good evidence that it is possible for crews to pinpoint gun positions accurately from heights of approximately 15000 ft. provided that the enemy do not use flashless propellant.

5. Communications.

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a. W/T channels were fairly satisfactory but overcrowded with transmissions. All aircraft of 14th Combat Wing discharged "Window" in their target area. Two "carpet-blinker" aircraft were dispatched from 44th Bomb Group jamming appeared effective, requiring enemy radars to switch frequencies. Satisfactory equipment operation was reported.

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SUBJECT: Operations Officar's Report, Mission of 23 May 1944.

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Commanding Officer, 458th Bombardsent Group (H).

1. General Marrative - See the enclosed Command Pilot's marrative.

2. Aircraft Not Attacking - Thirty (30) sircraft took off and left our base in the formation shown in the enclosed formation diagram. One (1) ai rcraft, 42-110172, crashed in midair with a B-17 before becoming dispatched. Twenty nine (29) aircraft were dispatched.

3. Of the twenty nine (29) aircraft dispatched, all went over the target an d dropped bombs on the target. All are credited with sorties and with an attack.

4. Twenty nine (29) aircraft dropped bombs on the primary target, Bourges airfield.

5. Lost Aircraft - One (1) aircraft, 42-110172, was lost in a midair collision with a B-17 over England. All other aircraft returned safely to ou r base.

SUBJECT: Lead Navigator's Narrative, Mission of 23 May 1944.

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TO: Commanding Officer, 458th Bombardment Group (n/, AAF 123, APO 558.

1. The assembly of the first section of the 458th Group was accomplished readil y on Splasher 5, but the 466th Group, on whom we were supposed to tack onto, was very ragged. Planes were going in all directions with no semblance of order. Assembly was completed on time and we proceeded to Bu 7 without incide nt. Tenetenths (10/10) undercast of stratus clouds all during assembly and route over Engla nd. On way to Spl 10 on course in the vicinity of the town of Diss, a group of B-17's flying course of approximately 320 degrees flew collision course with the 458th on course of 250 degrees mag. A p-17 collided with out deputy lead. The tail of the B-24 was completely c ut off; the B-24 hung in mid a ir for a moment then plunged earth-ward. The B-17 surged upward after the collision and seemed to turn upside down before spinning into the clouds. The time was 0653 and no chutes were observed by Grew 41 to eme rge from the planes. Division assembly was flown very well from thereon.

2. <u>Route in</u>: Flown on course to W. I.P., G. I.P. and Target. A haze limite d visibility in first fifty (50) miles of France, but visibility improved stea dily. The target was clear, a good run was made and good results on MPI were observed by the 1st section of the 458th bombs.

3. <u>Route Out</u>: on the route out a slight deviation was made to gain time on pre ceding wing, but had no effect on mission. No flak was observed except at Chaleandun, which was well out of our range. After leaving enemy coast route was flown very near the briefed course. Route was flown very near the briefe d course. "Gee" worked about fifty (50) miles into French territory Stud 1, and metro winds were fairly accurate.

4. Remarks: The Navigation of the 466th Group was excellent.
