



                    c. The Belfort Marshalling Yards bombing was fair, with the southern half of the yards blanketed by hits, and many bombs placed in the locomotive

                    shed, repair shops and in the carriage and wagon repair shop. The first

                    Squadron of the 453rd Group, leading the 2nd Combet Wing, missed the IP because of ground haze and bombed the Marchalling Yards at Tonnerre with

                    poor results, mistaking it for Troyes due to a similarity of check points.

                    The formations in trail realized the mistake and went on to attack the

                    Brotigny Airfield as a last resort target with good results. Bombs were
                    placed in the hanger area, numerous repear shops, workshops and sheds. There
                    were many good hits on the runways and landing grounds. Mulhouse Marshalling
                    Yards were bombed with fair results. Bombs were placed on the locomotivo
                    sheds, repair shops, trans-shipment sheds and tracks servicing this area. Damage was done to the roundhouse and roundhouse turn table and the sidings
                    received a large number of hits, destroying many wagons.
                               'd. No enti-eircraft fire was encountered at either Balfort or
                    Mulhouse. Meager to moderate inaccurate predictor control fire was encoun-
                    tored at Brotigny A/F. Losses were two aircraft to unknown causes. No

- a. The assigned primary targets for this mission were theM/Y at Belfort, Troyes and Mulhouse, France.
- b. The M/Y at Belfort were attacked by 3 Groups and the M/Y at Mulhouse were attacked by 6 Groups. All Groups bombed in Squadron formation. The M/Y at Troyes were not attacked due to navigation being off at the IP. The three Groups assigned to Troyes attacked their secondary, the A/D at Bretigny.
- c. One Squadron did not bomb when primary could not be found. Made run on Orly A/D and found it had been too well hit to waste bombs. One Squadron failed to bomb when the above mentioned Squadron did not bomb. Another Squadron bombed Tonnerre, France, through mistaken identity of the target. 2 A/C did not bomb due to rack malfunctions and another A/C released prematurely by accident.
- d. The bombing results on Belfort were fair and the results on Mulhouse were fair. The results on the last resort target at Bretigny were generally good.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

a. Targets:

Belfort M/Y Mulhouse M/Y Bretigny A/F

- (1) No AA fire was encountered at either Belfort or Mulhouse.
- (2) Meager to moderate inaccurate predictor control fire was encountered at Bretigny A/F.
- (3) Moderate gunfire was encountered from south of Peris, Oisemont, Noufchatel, Saumeray A/F and Nogert.
- (4) Meager gunfire was encountered from Rouen, Chateaudun, Orleans/
 Bricy A/F, Forges, Fourcarmont, Dreux, Pithiviers A/F and Ostend.
 Accurate gunfire was also encountered from five barges off
 Nicuport.
- (5) Gun positions were seen SE, NW and SW of Saumoray A/F.
- (6) Gun positions were also pinpointed at the SE corner of Orleans/ Bricy N/F, and on the SW edge of Pithiviers A/F.
- (7) Approximately 10 red bursts were seen 1 mile behind a formation in the Remirement area, but no enemy fighters were observed.



"Window" and carpet blinker RC! devices were used. Blinker indicated a concentration of enemy radars in 550 to 570 hc. bankd, and some frequency shifting when enemy radars were isomed. were jammed.
