c. Units Participating - 96th CEW (466th, 467th, 458th BG).
14th CEW (44th, 492nd, 392nd BG).
2nd CEW (389th, 445th, 453rd BG).
20th CEW (448th, 446th, 93rd BG).

a. Planning called for the 96th and 14th Combat Wings to attack the Zeitz Synthetic Oil Refinery, and the 2nd and 20th Combat Wings to attack the Horseburg Synthetic Oil Refinery. 312 aircraft were dispatched for this mission. Escort was furnished by two Groups of P-47s, two Groups of P-38s and one Group of P-51s.

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b. Assemblies were accomplished without incident and routes flown as planned.

c. Bombing at Zeitz was of outstanding excellence. Severe damage was done to the refinery plants and storage tanks; the gas treatment plant, a pump house, several stills, and the compression and carbon dioxide removal plant were badly damaged. Bombing was fair at Merseburg; damage extended across the central portion of the works, installations of the synthetic oil section, the fertilizer section, boiler houses and gas plant. Further damage southwest of the target area affects the complex railway system outside the works. Smoke screens, smoke from the target and haze caused difficulty at the targets, causing four Squadrons to attack Zeitz instead of Merseburg. Eleven targets of opportunity were attacked with forces of from one to ten aircraft.

d. All units attacking Mersburg encountered moderate to intense and accurate predictor control fire. Only four inaccurate bursts of anti-aircraft fire were seen at the Zeitz Refinery. Gunfire was encountered enroute at Jena, Le Culot, Koblenz and the Dummer Lake areas. Losses were three aircraft, two lost to flak and one to unknown causes. Claims were nil. Fighter support was very good.

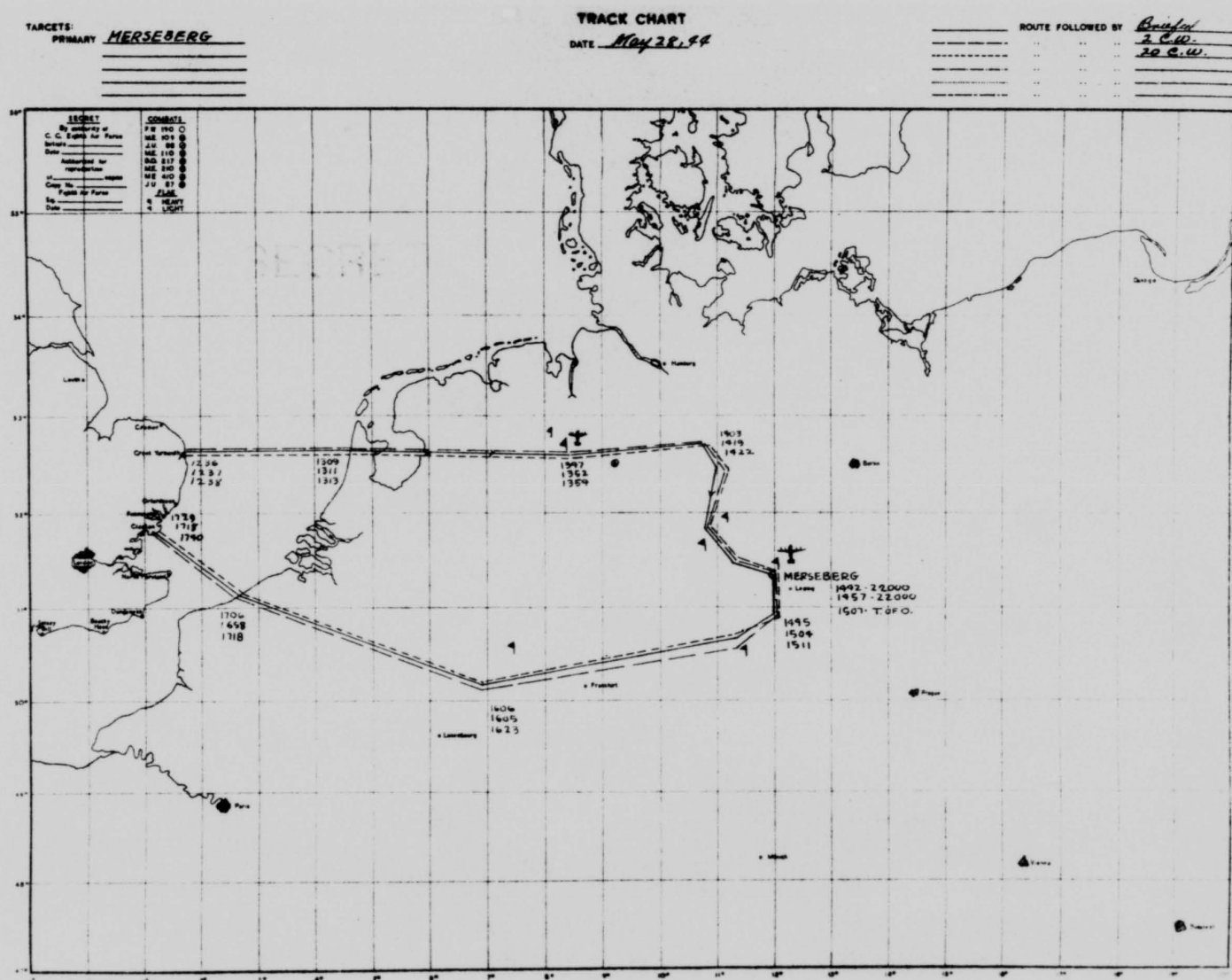

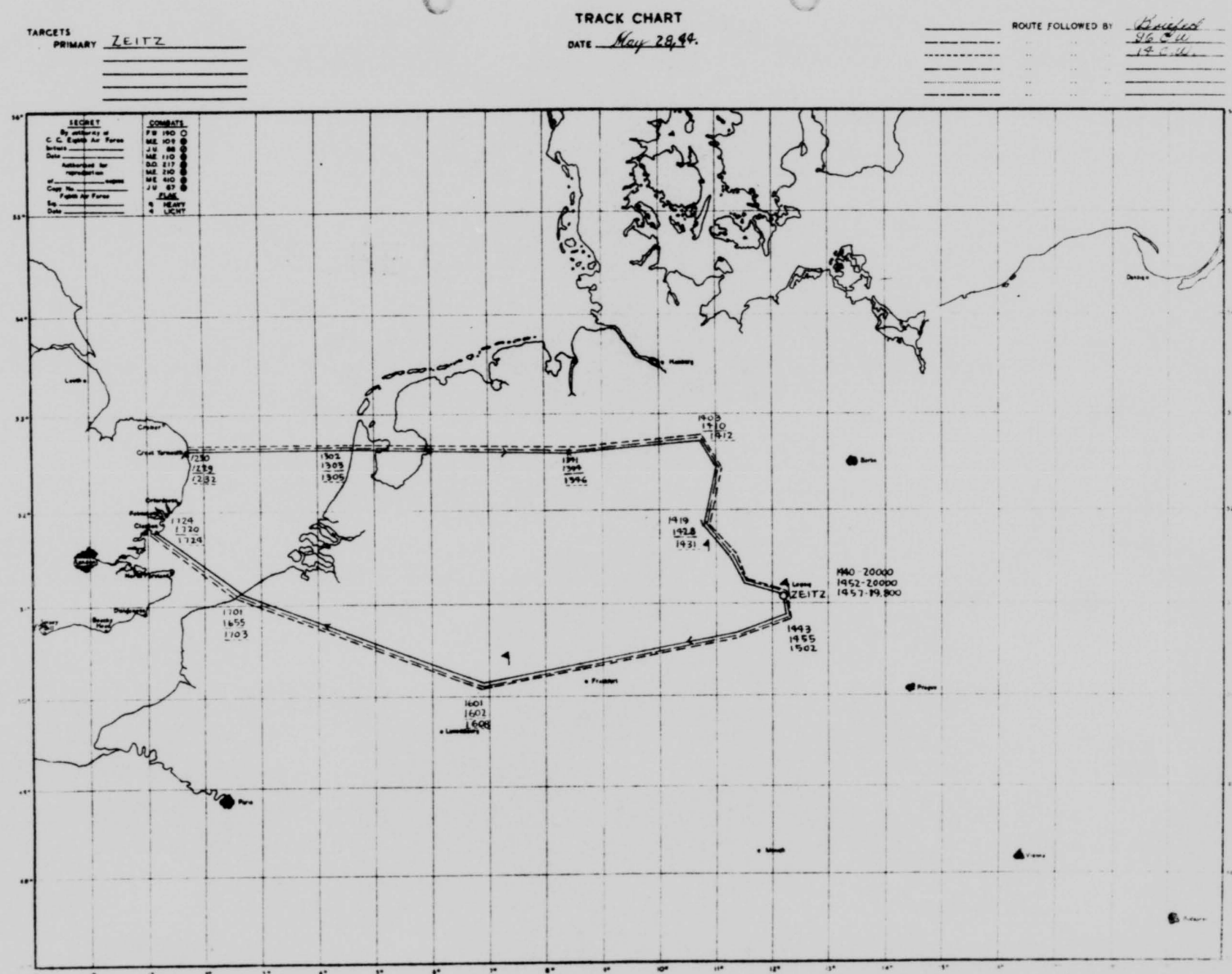

- The assigned primary targets for this mission were the oil refineries at Merseburg and Zeitz, Germany.
- Merseburg was to be attacked by six Groups bombing by Squadrons, but due to bomb smoke of preceding Groups and interference from other Groups, it was attacked by three Groups plus 7 A/C of other Groups. Zeitz was attacked by six Groups bombing in Squadron formation. Four Squadrons, with Merseburg as their assigned primary, bombed Zeitz as a last resort target due to the difficulties stated above.
- The following last resort targets were attacked due to the before mentioned difficulties. 10 A/C Limburg, 8 A/C Meiningen, 1 A/C Trirlis, 1 A/C Ulzen, 1 A/C Egmond, 1 A/C Altenburg, 1 A/C Vechta. Due to a bombsight malfunction, 8 A/C bombed Saalfeld. 1 A/C attacked Diepholz, 1 A/C attacked the A/D at Meppel and 1 A/C attacked an unidentified target. 1 A/C failed to bomb due to battle damage.
- The results of bombing at Merseburg was fair. The assigned MPI was not hit but scattered concentrations did some damage to the refinery. The results of bombing at Zeitz were very good with direct hits on the MPI.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.a. Targets - Merseburg
Zeitz

- (1) All Groups in the 2nd Wing encountered moderate to intense and accurate predictor control fire from Merseburg.
- (2) The 400th Group led the attack on Zeitz and encountered only four inaccurate bursts of AA fire. No AA fire was encountered at this target by either of the other Groups in this Wing or by any Group in the 14th Wing. However, the 20th Wing approached the target from the north and encountered intense and accurate gunfire from the defenses of Merseburg during their bombing runs.
- (3) Moderate to intense gunfire was encountered on route at Jena and Le Culot.
- (4) Meager to moderate gunfire was encountered on route at Wernigerode, Koblenz, Vechta, Dummer Lake, Lingen and Halberstadt. Crews believed that the gun positions in the Dummer Lake area were situated near the railway between the Lake and Diepholz A/F, and also in the vicinity of Darme, but they were unable to pinpoint them exactly.
- (5) Balloons were seen at Saslborg, Saalfeld, and from some barges on the Rhine at 50 12'N 07 40'E. The balloons at Saalfeld were seen round a dam.
- (6) One A/C of the 445th Group was shot down at Merseburg at 21000 ft, and one A/C of the 44th Group was shot down near the Dummer Lake at 21000 ft.

4. Enemy Aircraft Encounters.

- a. There were no E/A attacks against the Division; however, one ME 410 was observed in the Nienburg area doing 360 degree turn. This E/A came to within 600 yards of one Group and was fired upon, although not actually attacking the Group.

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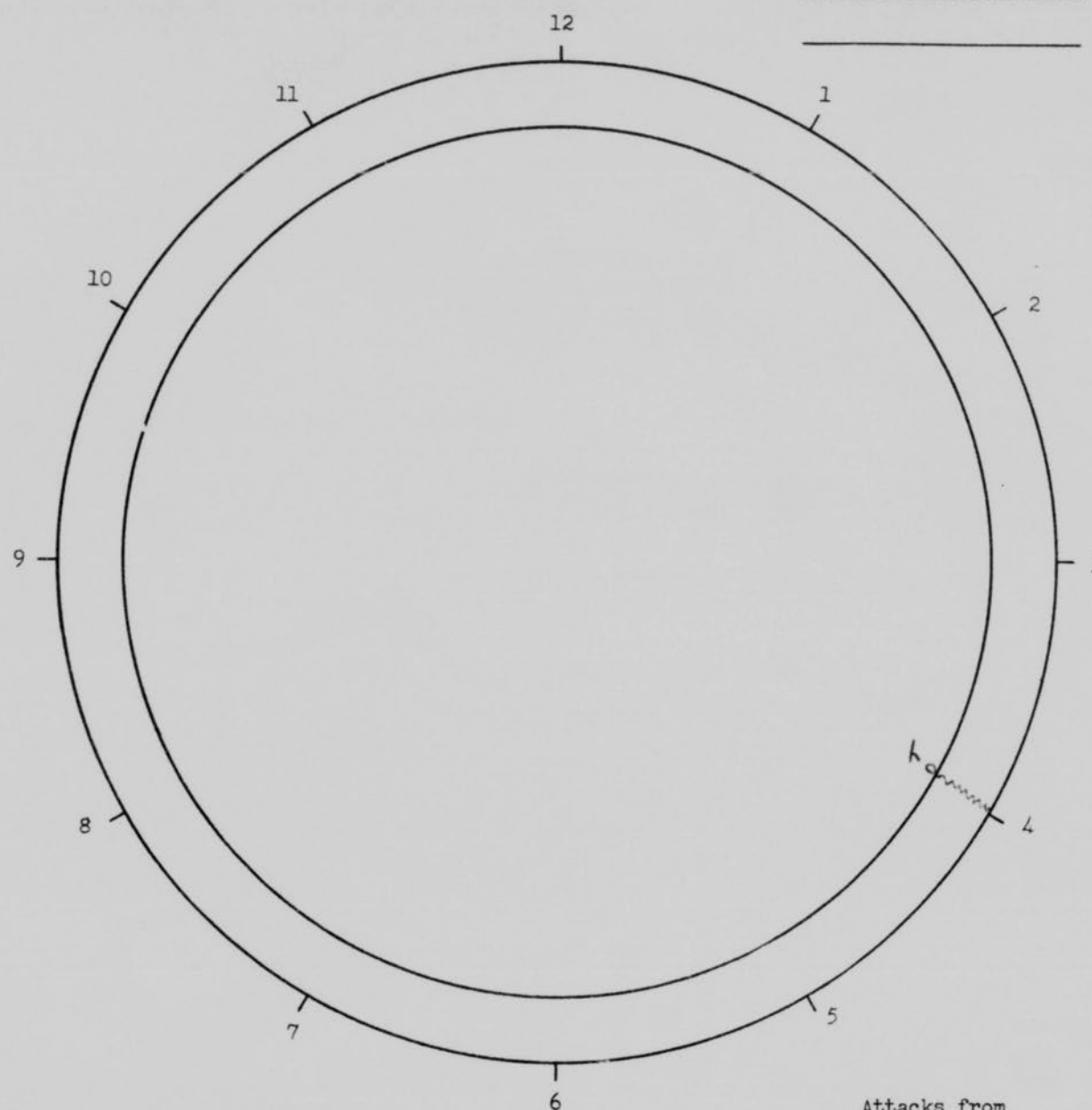

5. Communications.

- a. W/T and R/T communications were satisfactory, with the exception of an irregular malfunction of the VHF ground receiver at Division Headquarters. Trouble on this was cleared immediately. "Window" and "Carpet-blinker" were used as RCM. Carpet jamming caused enemy radars to change frequency and forced some radars to change from tracking to searching. Equipment performed satisfactorily. Requirements indicated for a directional blinker receiver antenna which will exclude signals lateral to and in rear of formation, and a filter which will exclude PRF's other than G/L radar. Development work on this has been initiated.

SUBJECT: Command Pilot's Narrative, Mission of 28 May 1944.

T O : Commanding Officer, 458th Bombardment Group (H)
 AAF 123, APO 558.

The 458th Bomb Group lead the "B" Group of the 96th Combat Wing with a lead Squadron and a low left Squadron plus a high right Squadron furnished by the 467th Group.

The 458th Group took off at 1030 hours for an assembly at 17,000 feet over Splasher #5. The assembly was made by 1147 hours and the Wing assembly was accomplished. The 96th Wing departed Splasher #5 for Buncher #5, the beginning of the Division assembly line. Immediately on leaving Splasher #5, we had difficulties with a Wing of B-17's coming from the west. By maneuvering through their Wing, we were able to make our times good at the Division assembly line.

The 96th Combat Wing lead the Division on the mission and we were the first Wing of the Division out. We were about two (2) minutes late at CP 1 and on course. The climb was started at this point and continued until 23,000 feet was reached. We were three (3) minutes late at CP 2 and on course. At CP 3, we were approximately four (4) minutes late, but on course and at reference altitude, 21,000 feet. The maneuver at the I.P. was accomplished without trouble. The primary target was attacked with fair results. The rally after the target was normal and the withdrawal was along the briefed route.

No enemy fighters were seen although our fighter support reported some in the area. Going in to the target and coming out, we saw no fighters.

Our fighter support was excellent and all fighter rendezvous points were made and fighters contacted.

The weather was as briefed except for contrails encountered just inside enemy coast. Three to four tneths cloud coverage in the target area with haze was encountered.
