SUBJECT: Tactical Report of Mission, 30 May 1944.

TO : Commanding General, Eighth Air Force, AAF 101, APO 634.

- a. Date of Mission 30 May 1944.
- b. Primary Targets:

Rotenburg A/F - 14th and 20th Combat Wings Oldenburg A/F - 2nd "A" and 2nd "B" Combat Wings Zwischenhahn A/F - 96th Combat Wing

c. Secondary Targets:

Stade A/F - 14th and 20th Combat Wings Nordholz A/F - 96th, 2nd "A" and "B" Combat Wings

- d. Last Resort Target Any military objective positively identified as being inside Germany or any airfield in occupied territory not adjacent to a built-up area.
- o. Units Participating 14th CBW (44th, 392nd, 492nd BG).
 20th CBW (446th, 448th, 93rd BG).
 2nd "A" CBW (389th, 453rd BG).

a. 369 aircraft from four Combat Wings were dispatched to visually attack the airfields at Rotenburg, Oldenburg and Zwischenhahn, Germany. Two Groups of P-51s, one Group of P-38s, one Group of P-47s and three Squadrons of RAF Mustangs provided fighter support.


b. Assemblies were accomplished without incident and the route was flown generally as briefed.


c. Six Groups attacked the airfield at Rotenburg with very good results. Considerable damage was done to hangars, barracks, and all adjacent facilities. Zwischenhahn Airfield was attacked by three Groups with very good results. MPI's were well covered and damage was sustained to perimeter facilities and landing ground. Four Groups attacked the Airfield at Oldenburg with good results. Hits were made on hangars, barracks, dispersal areas and landing ground.

d. All units encountered moderate accurate predictor control gunfire at Oldenburg and Zwischenhahn Airfields with no anti-aircraft fire at Rotenburg Airfield. Meager to moderate ginfire was encountered enroute at Nordholz Airfield, Neuenwalde, Wesermunde, Alte Mellum, Diepholz Airfield, Vechta Airfield, Heligoland, Nieunburg and Schillig. No enemy aircraft were encountered and fighter support was very good. One aircraft was lost to an unknown cause. Claims were nil.



 - (1) No AA fire was encountered at Rotenburg A/F.
 - (2) All Groups encountered moderate and accurate predictor control fire at both Oldenburg A/F and Zwischenahn A/F.
 - (3) Meager to moderate Gunfire was encountered on route at Nordholz A/F, Neuenwalde, Wesemunde, Alte Mellum, Diepholz A/F, Vechta A/F, Heligoland, Nienburg, and Schillig.
 - (4) Balloons were seen at Heligoland.

a. W/T and R/T communications channels were satisfactory. VHF relay aircraft relayed one message from an aircraft about 300 miles from base. Some interference on Division W/T channel was reported by three Groups. Excellent results were obtained on Northeastern GEE chain. Carpet blinker RCM equipment was dispatched. Frequencies jammed ranged from 492 to 575 mc., with greatest concentration between 550 to 570 mc. Successful jamming was indicated by frequency changes and cessation of operation of enemy radars.





TO: Commanding Officer, 458th Bomburdment Group (H).

- 1. General Marrative See the enclosed Command Pilot's narrative.
- 2. Aircraft Not Attacking Twenty four (24) aircraft took off and left our base in the formation shown in the enclosed formation diagram. All aircraft were dispatched, received sortie, and made an attack.
 - 3. All aircraft attacked the primary target, Zwischenan Airdrome.
- 4. Lost Aircraft None of our mircraft were lost. All returned safely to base.

SUBJECT: Command Pilot's Narrative, Mission of 30 May 1944.


TO : Commanding Officer, 458th Bombardment Group (H)
AAF 123, APO 558.

- 1. Take off as scheduled at 0725 was normal with Group assembly at 17,000 feet on time at Splasher 5. We were flying high right section of twelve ships on the 466th Group. The Wing and Division assemblies were normal exce pt for a two minute delay at King's Lynn and the turning point north of Cambridge.
- 2. Section departed English coast two minutes late, on course with a good formation at which point our climb was begun. Enemy coast was reached on time byt 2,000 feet above briefed altitude. I reminded the leader of this fact several times but no let down was made.
- 3. At the Wing Uncovering Point, we uncovered and attempted to set up the C-1, but were unsuccessful due to the necessity for maneuvering. However, we succeeded at the Group I.P. At this point the 466th Group two sections made too wide a turn and did not come over the Group I.P. on the correct heading into the target. We turned as briefed and came over the Group I.P. on cour se which brought about the fact that we bombed between the first and second sections instead of the last. No danger was involved and bombs went
- 4. Our rallies were as briefed and we regained our position immediately afte r bombs away.
- 5. Over the target and rally points, we were subjected to moderate flak which was rather inaccurate as we were still at:23,000 feet.
- 6. Let down was begun at the enemy coast and we broke formation upon return to the English coast and made an uneventful landing. All ships returned safely and with no damage.
- 7. It is recommended that the lead sections maintain more satisfactory airspeed as 2t was extremely difficult to fly the proper formation throughout the entire mission.
