2. Narrative.

a. 421 aircraft from four Combat Wings were dispatched to visually attack Stade, Luneburg and Fassburg airfields in Northwestern Germany. Twelve H2X ships were dispatched for navigational purposes and for use in bombing if visual methods could not be employed.

b. Assembly was accomplished without incident and the briefed route was generally flown.

c. Target area was covered with 5/10 to 10/10 cloud and only one Group visually attacked the assigned primary target, Stade A/F, with poor results. Three Squadrons visually attacked various targets of opportunity: Haussur A/F with good results, hits being scored on the hangars and landing ground; Nordenham with good results with hits on docks and built-up areas around the docks; and Heligoland with poor results. The PFF primary target, the city of Hamburg, was attacked on H2X by twelve Squadrons. Hits were observed in industrial areas, dock areas and a railway junction. Six Squadrons attacked Bremerhaven on H2X, the PFF secondary target, with good results. Several warehouses were destroyed or damaged. Four Squadrons attacked Wesermunde, a target of opportunity on H2X. Hits were observed in the center of the city.

d. Moderate to intense accurate flak was encountered over Bremerhaven and Hamburg. Moderate gunfire was encountered enroute at Cuxhaven, Wilhelmshaven and from ships off Wilhelmshaven. Meager gunfire was encountered enroute at Itzehol, Neumunster, Rendsburg, Heligoland, Neuwerk, Scharnhorn Island, Wangerooge, and Schwerin A/F. No enemy aircraft were encountered and friendly fighter support was very good. Four aircraft were lost to enemy anti-aircraft fire. Claims were nil.

1. The assigned primary targets for this mission, if visual, were the airfields at Stade, Luneburg, and Fassburg, Germany. If bombing was PFF, the primary was Hamburg and the secondary, Bremerhaven.
2. There was some confusion in the target area as to whether bombing was to be done on the visual targets or PFF targets. In most cases the visual primary targets were covered by 10/10 cloud and formations attacked the PFF primary and secondary.

3. Nine A/C did not bomb when they were scattered on the bomb run through interference by other Groups. Two A/C did not bomb due to rack malfunctions, and six A/C did not bomb due to mechanical difficulties.
4. Results of Bombing:
 - Stade A/F - Poor - Bombfall in open fields, 2 miles SE of target.
 - Hamburg - partially unobserved - hits in industrial areas, dock areas and railway junction.
 - Haussum A/F - Good - hangars and landing ground hit.
 - Wesermünde - partially unobserved - Incendiary bombs hit in center of city.
 - Bremershaven - Good - several warehouse buildings destroyed and damaged.
 - Nordenham - Good - Hits on docks and built up areas around docks.
 - Heligoland - Poor - Bombfall in the water.

3. Anti-aircraft Fire.

a. Targets:

- (1) Bremerhaven
- (2) Hamburg
- (3) Stade A/F

b. All Groups encountered moderate to intense and fairly accurate gunfire over Bremerhaven. Most of this fire appears to have been chiefly a combination of fixed barrages and predicted concentrations, although some predictor control fire was also encountered presumably whenever the weather conditions permitted "seen" fire.

c. ~~The AA firing was~~ encountered at Hamburg and Stade A/F. ~~There was~~ an accurate predicted concentration, but the following Groups encountered mainly fixed

d. barrages although a small amount of predictor control fire was also encountered at this target.

e. No AA fire was encountered at Stade A/F.

f. Moderate gunfire was encountered on route at Cuxhaven, Wilhelmshaven, and from ships off Wilhelmshaven.

g. Meager gunfire was encountered enroute at Itzehoe, Neumunster, Rendsburg, Heligoland, Neuwerk, Scharnhorn I, Wangerooge, and Schwerin A/F. A 4-gun position was also pinpointed between Spiek and Nordholz.

h. Rockets were seen at both Hamburg and Bremerhaven, a few of which emitted a cloud of silver sparklers when they burst. Rockets were also seen at Wenzendorf which emitted wires with burning objects attached to them. A rocket was seen at Hamburg which burst into a puff of black smoke from which grey streamers of smoke shot out.

i. An unidentified B-24 flew a parallel course to the 492nd Group, approximately 2000 yards to the right of the formation, from Hamburg to Wilhelmshaven. This Group encountered exceptionally accurate gunfire, and as this B-24 appeared to have no markings, it is suspected of being hostile and may have been correcting the height of the fire by wireless.

j. One of the A/C of the 448th Group was shot down over Hamburg at 22000 ft. One A/C of the 492nd Group was badly damaged by AA fire at Rendsburg and landed in Sweden. Another A/C of the 492nd Group was badly damaged by AA fire at Bremerhaven and ditched in the North Sea.

5. Communications.

- a. In addition to normal use of "window" as a radar counter-measure, the spot-jamming "carpet-blinker" equipment was used. Two aircraft dispatched jammed frequencies from 525 to 570 mcs. The presence of numerous GL radar transmissions in the lower frequency end of the Wurzburg range was noted in the target area. 15 H2X equipped aircraft were dispatched from two squadrons. Five used grid system of bombing, three bombed by H2X, and four bombed visually. Equipment difficulties prevented use of remaining sets.
