- a. Date of Mission - 21 June 1944.
- b. Primary Targets - 2nd Combat Wing - Neiderschonweide, Marienfield.
14th Combat Wing - Genshagen.
20th Combat Wing - Genshagen, Marienfield.
96th Combat Wing - Genshagen.
- c. Secondary Target - All Combat Wings - Center of Berlin..
- d. Last Resort Target - Any military installation positively identified as being in Germany.
- e. Units Participating - 2nd CEW (389th, 445th, 453rd BG).
14th CBW (44th, 392nd, 492nd BG).
20th CEW (93rd, 446th, 448th BG).
96th CEW (458th, 466th, 467th BG).

2. Narrative.

- a. 367 aircraft were dispatched to visually attack industrial targets at Genshagen, Marienfield and Neiderschoneweide in the Berlin area. Seventeen H2X aircraft were dispatched to aid in navigation and for use in the event Pathfinder bombing was necessary. Four Groups of P-47s, three Groups of P-38s and three Groups of P-51s provided fighter support.
- b. Assemblies were accomplished without difficulty and in very good order. The route was flown generally as briefed throughout the mission.
- c. The target areas were covered with 5/10 to 10/10 cloud, and bombing was accomplished by H2X methods. Most units attacked the secondary target, the center of Berlin. One primary target, Neiderschoneweide, was attacked by three Squadrons which scored hits on the MPI, railroad and industrial area. Results were for the most part unobserved, but PRU reports show more than 30 concentrations of bursts over a widespread area in the heart of the city. At least six large fires were started among industrial, mercantile and residential districts. Direct hits were made on a wide variety of installations, manufacturing plants, government buildings and railway facilities. Direct hits were also scored on three of the most important railway stations, the Potsdamer, Anhalter and Friedrichstrasse Stations. The following targets of opportunity were attacked with good to unobserved results: Potsdam, Stendal, Michendorf, Rangsorf, Trebbin and Selzig.
- d. Intense accurate gunfire was encountered over Berlin by all Groups. Numerous rockets were also encountered over Berlin, but these were generally inaccurate. Moderate gunfire was encountered enroute at Longoog Island, Burg Airfield, Rendsburg, Magdeburg and Scharnhorn Island. Approximately 125 enemy aircraft were encountered in the target area. The majority of these were engaged by the friendly fighter support and only 1/3 of them succeeded in attacking the bombers. Escorting fighter protection was described as excellent. Losses were seven to enemy AA fire, two to enemy aircraft and ten to unknown causes. Claims were ten destroyed, three probably destroyed and nine damaged.

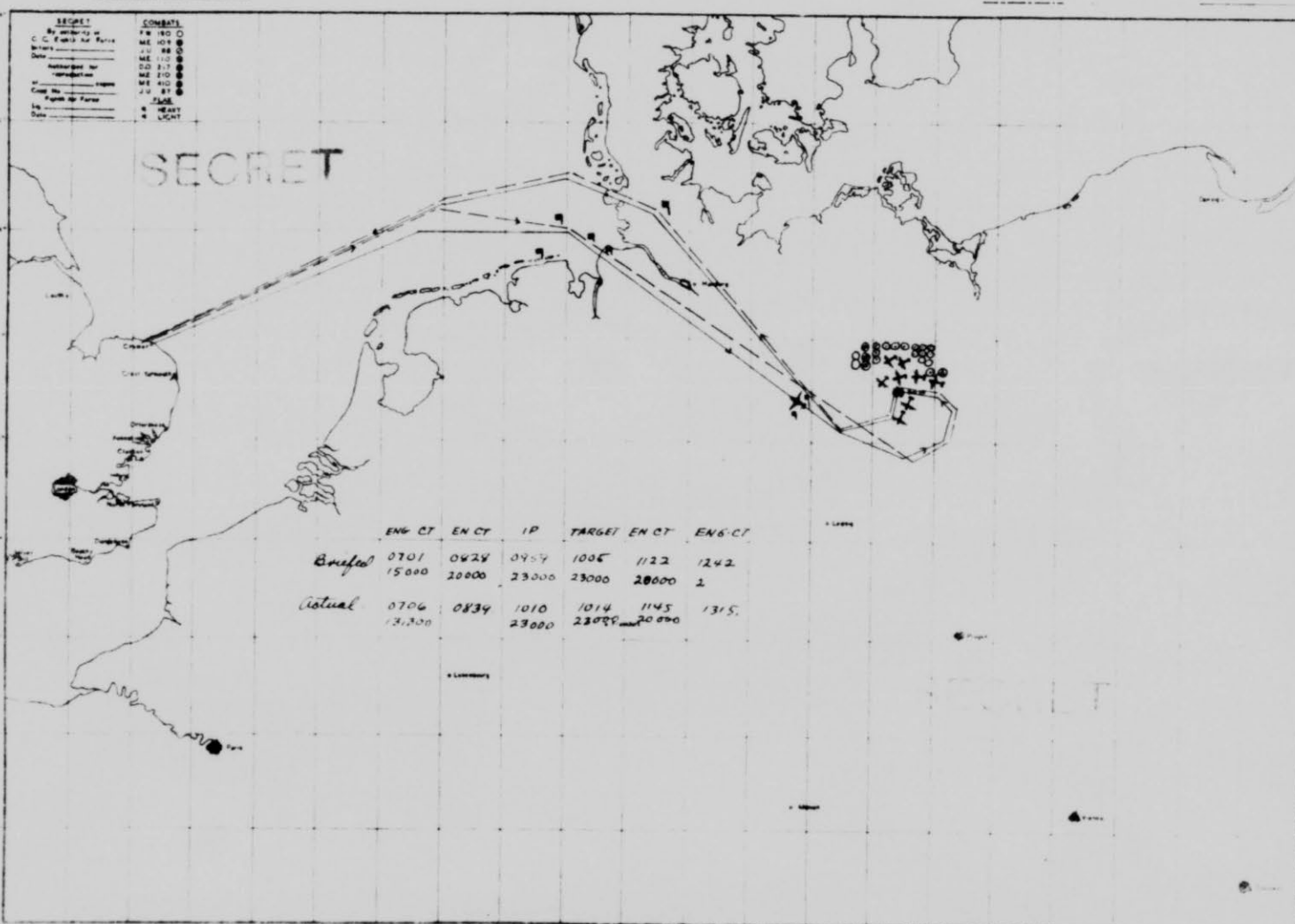

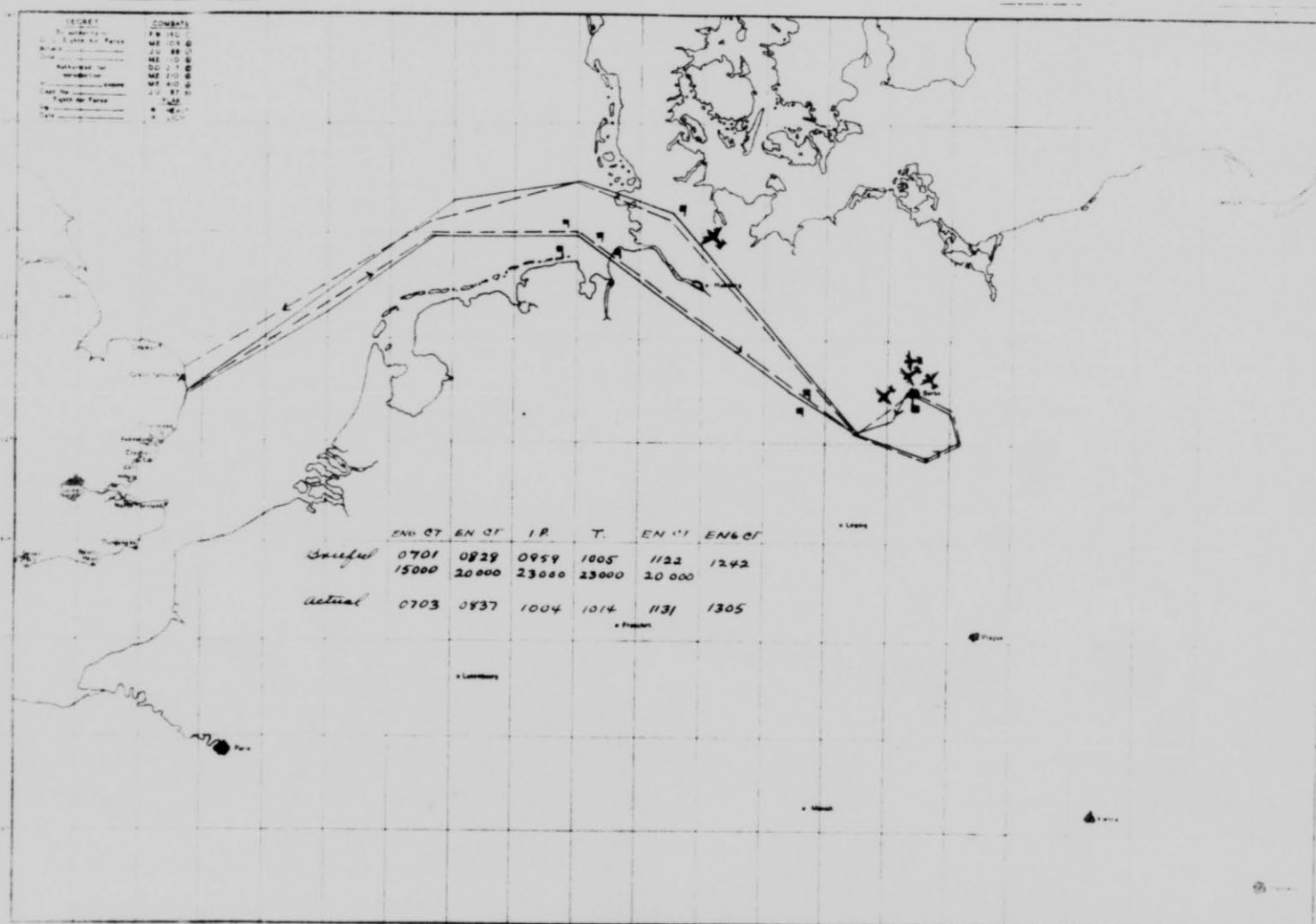

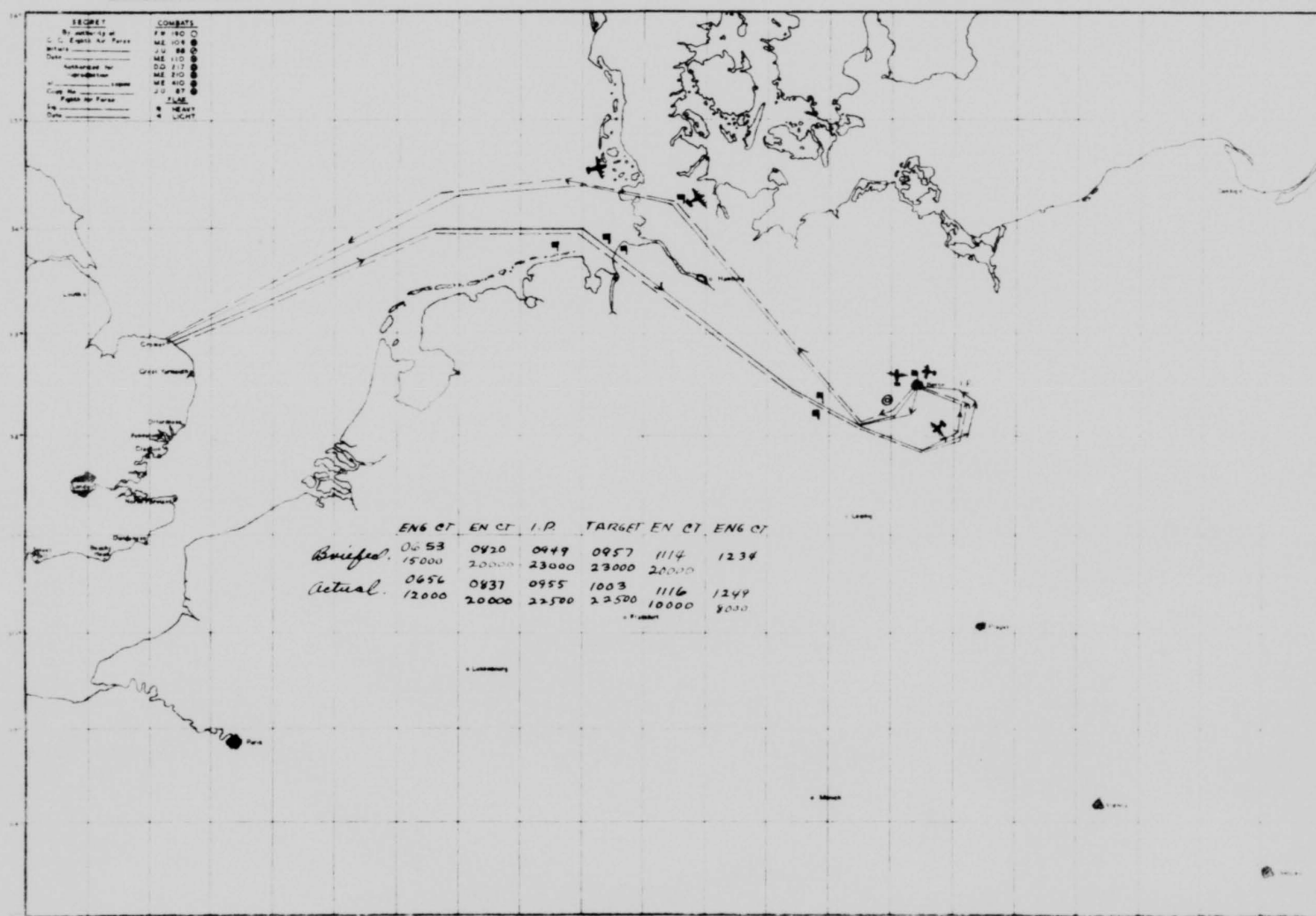

- a. The assigned primary targets for this mission were Berlin and Genshagen, Germany. PFF A/C were assigned to each Wing for navigational purposes and in the event Pathfinder bombing was necessary. If Pathfinder bombing was necessary, the target was the center of the city.

- b. Due to cloud conditions in the primary target areas, various targets were attacked both visually and on PFF equipment.
- c. All A/C over the targets dropped bombs.
- d. Results of bombing:

Genshagen - partially unobserved to poor. Bombfall observed was in open fields.
Marienfeld - Unobserved.
Berlin - Fair. Hits in south part of city in built-up areas and railroad sidings, partially unobserved.
Michendorf - Fair. Bombfall on railroad sidings and open fields.
Potsdam - Partially unobserved - some bombs in open areas.
Neiderschonneide - Good. Hits on MPI, railroad and industrial area.
Rangsdorf - Poor. Bombfall in open fields.
Trebbin - Unobserved.
Selzig - Unobserved.
Stendal - Fair. Hits on railroad and built-up area.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

- a. Targets - (1) Genshagen (Berlin)
(2) Marienfelde (Berlin)
(3) Neiderschonneide (Berlin)
(4) Various targets in Berlin
- b. Intense and accurate gunfire was encountered by all Groups over Berlin. In some areas fixed barrages were fired, while in others predictor control fire was employed. Although no definite conclusions can be drawn, it is probable that fixed barrages were fired whenever weather conditions prevented visual laying. Numerous rockets were also encountered over Berlin, but these were generally inaccurate.
- c. Moderate gunfire was encountered on route at Langeoog Island, Burg A/F, Rendsburg, Magdeburg and Scharnhorn Island. Crews estimated that there were approximately 8 guns in the immediate vicinity of Burg A/F.
- d. Meager gunfire was encountered at Heligoland and Cuxhaven.
- e. Six A/C were shot down over Berlin and one at Magdeburg.

4. Enemy Aircraft Encounters.

- a. The leading Group of the leading Combat Wing, 96A, report sightings of 10 SE E/A in the Berlin area, but suffered no attacks. The high Group of this Wing also reports nil opposition. The lead Group of 96B Combat Wing report attacks in the Berlin area, from 1007 to 1012 hours, by 20-25 FW 190s and Me 109s. Attacks were generally from 3 to 9 o'clock level and from 7 o'clock low.
- b. The lead Group of the 14th Combat Wing reports nil opposition. The Group flying echeloned right report an attack by 4 Me 109s on a straggler in the Berlin area at 1010 hours. Attacks on the straggler were by pairs of E/A from 6 o'clock low to level. Only one pass was made as the E/A were driven off by escorting by P-38s. The Group flying high right on the lead report 5 Me 109s in the Furstenwalde area but were not attacked.
- c. The 20th Combat Wing reports nil opposition.
- d. The lead Group of the 2A Combat Wing reports 6 JU 88s, 6 Me 410s and 20 Me 109s in the Berlin area. The JU 88s attempted to make a frontal attack, in trail, on a following Group but were driven off by P-51s. The lead Group of the 2B Combat Wing report observations of about 65 E/A. This Group was subjected to several attacks. Approximately 25 Me 109s and 12 FW 190s attacked in the area 5152N-1338E at 0958 hours. One pass was made from 2 to 3 o'clock level and to within 200 yards before breaking away. The FW 190s were observed to have markings similar to our P-47s. A few scattered attacks were from the rear. Again in the area of Heinersdorf to Zassen in the Berlin area. The Group was attacked by 10-12 Me 109s and FW 190s. These attacks were from 11 to 12 o'clock high, pressing in very close before breaking away. Four separate attacks of this nature were made in the area mentioned. The Group flying high right on the lead Group report approximately 25 TE E/A in the Furstenwalde area. These started an attack from 2 o'clock high but P-51s broke it up before it became effective. At the target more attacks were experienced by 20-40 FW 190s and Me 109s. Attacks were from the nose and the tail, high to low.
- e. Enemy action against units of this Division was relatively weak considering the estimated sorties flown by E/A. It is estimated that 125 E/A operated against this Division. All sightings and encounters were generally in the target area. Conspicuous by their absence were the large number of TE Me 410s which were encountered on the strategic mission of 20 June. A few Me 410s and JU 88s were seen but the coordinated rocket and cannon attacks were lacking. Escorting fighter protection was described as excellent.

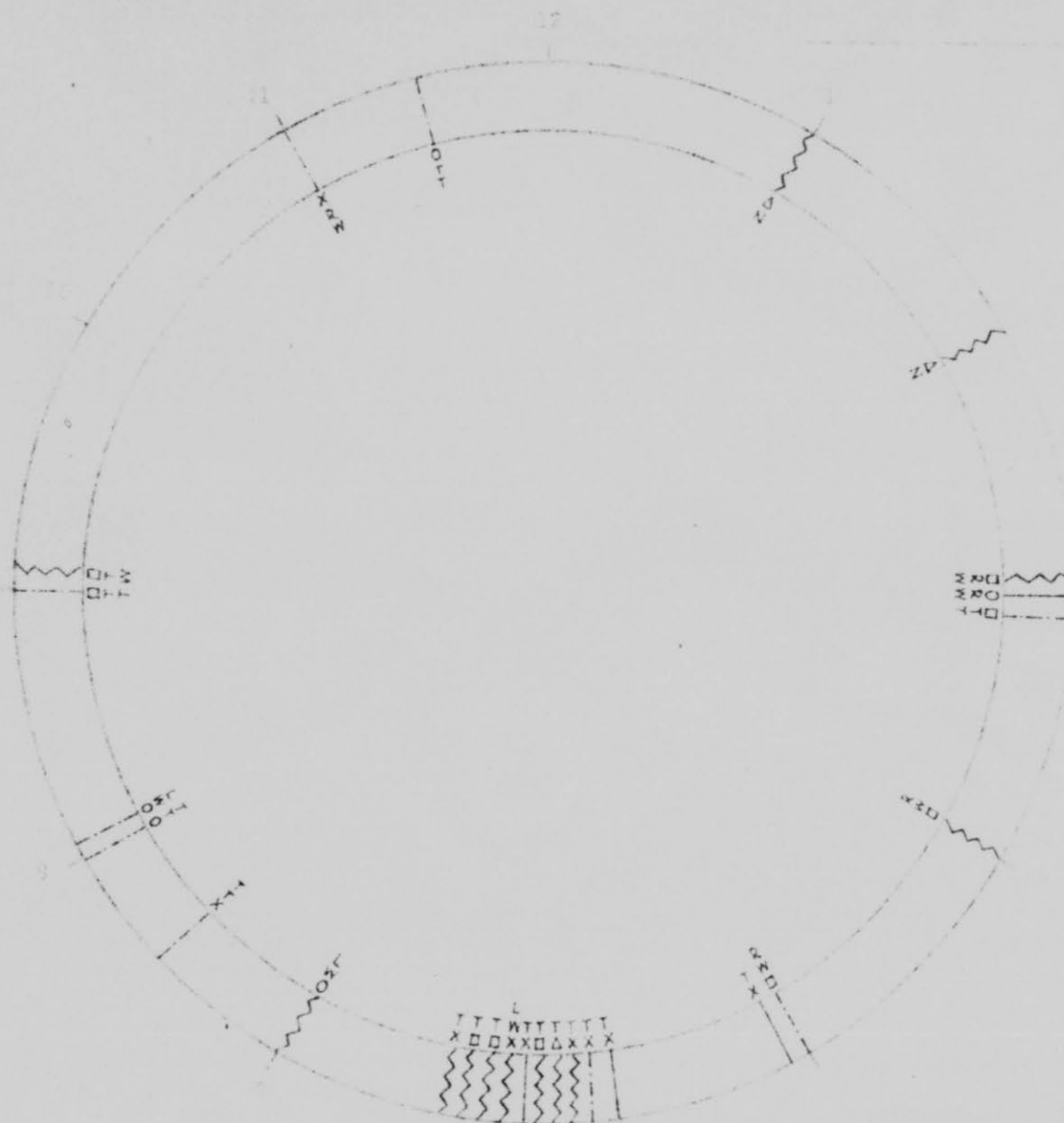
