a. Date of Mission - 29 June 1944.

20th Combat Wing - Bernburg

c. Secondary Targets :

20th Combat Wing - Magdeburg

2. Narrative.

a. 472 aircraft were dispatched by five Combat Wings, each Wing to bomb as follows: 20th Combat Wing, Bernburg; 2nd Combat Wing, Kothen; 95th Combat Wing, Oschersleben; 14th Combat Wing, Magdeburg; and the 96th Combat Wing, Aschersleben. H2X aircraft were dispatched as aids to navigation. Two Groups of P-47s, two Groups of P-51s and two Groups of P-38s provided fighter escort.

b. During assembly clouds and contrails caused units to form 3500 feet above briefed altitude, resulting in a slow assembly and leaving the English coast approximately five minutes late. Routes were flown as briefed with slight deviations on times.

c. Results of bombing at Bernburg were good. Damage was done to an assembly shop, hangars and landing ground, in addition to near misses on hangars and damage to other facilities. Kothen was not attacked, due to 10/10 clouds, and targets of opportunity were attacked as well as the secondary at Stendal with good results. Hits were made on the landing grounds, perimeter strips and hangars. Gerdelegen A/F, a secondary target, was hit with very good results, with hits on hangars, perimeter strips and landing ground. Bombing at Burg A/F, a target of opportunity, was poor. Results at Oschersleben were good, the MPI's being covered and damage done to perimeter strips and buildings. Magdeburg was attacked with good results, with hits in business and residential areas, dock areas and built-up areas around the river. Results at Aschersleben were fair to good with hits on and around the MPI.

d. Accurate gunfire was encountered at all targets except Oschersleben and Burg A/F. Battle damage was heavy from flak, but no enemy aircraft were seen. Four aircraft were lost to flak, one to accident, and three to unknown causes. Claims were nil. Fighter support was good throughout the mission.

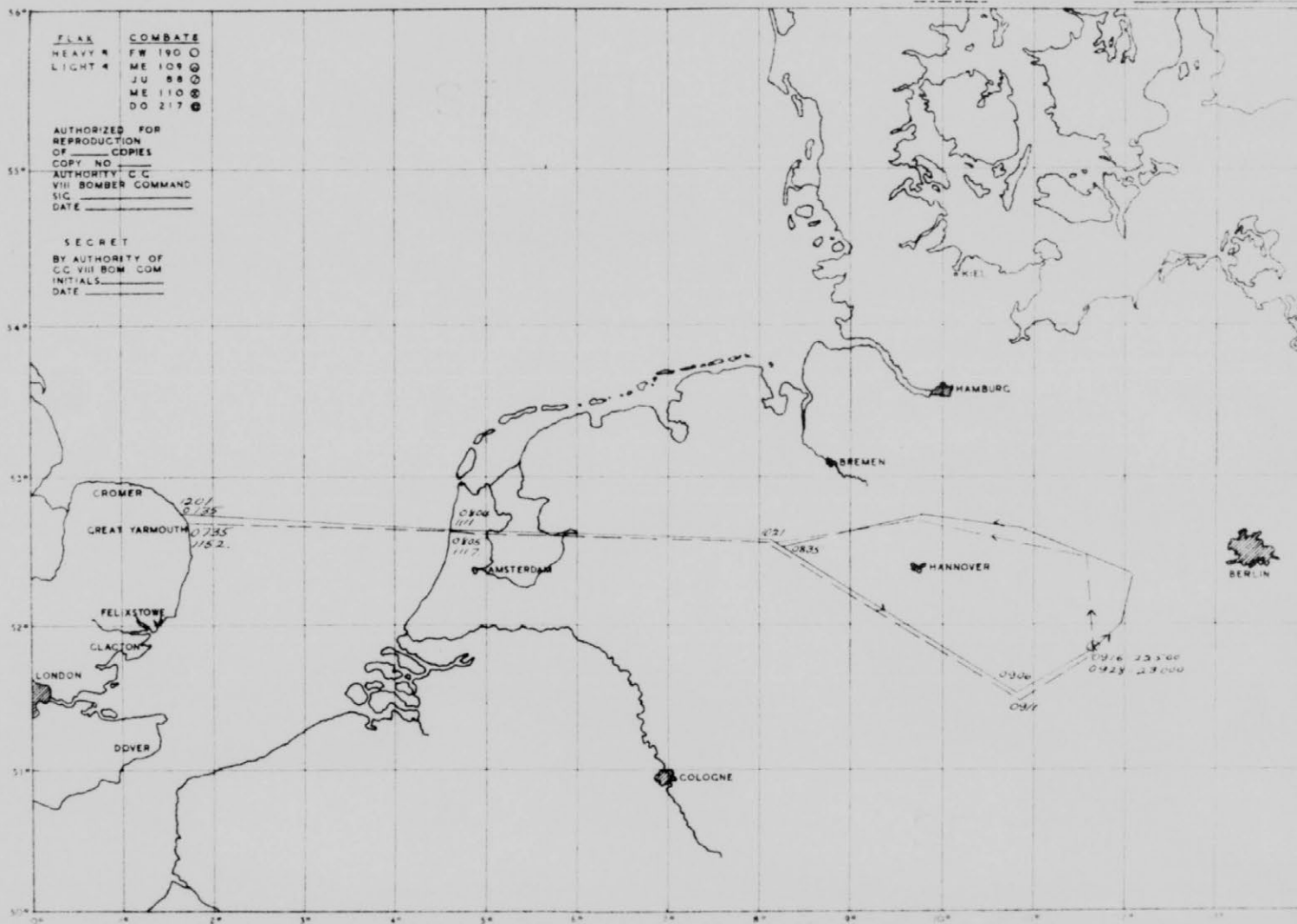

- a. The assigned primary targets for this mission were Bernburg, Aschersleben, Oschersleben, Magdeburg and Kothen, Germany.
- b. Bombing was accomplished in Squadron formation under visual conditions. PFF A/C were dispatched to lead part of the Groups and the Squadrons the PFF A/C led dropped on them visually. Kothen was not attacked due to 10/10 cloud and

targets of opportunity were hit as well as the secondary at Stendal. The 93rd Group attacked Burg A/F as a target of opportunity due to a bombsight failure in the lead FFF A/C at the primary. One Squadron of the 448th Group bombed a target of opportunity due to a bombsight failure and four A/C of the 458th Group attacked Leopoldshall due to battle damage to the lead A/C a few seconds before bombs away at the primary target. 6 A/C of the 445th Group attacked a M/Y at Obisfelde-Kaltendorf due to 10/10 cloud at the primary target of Kothen. The 389th Group attacked two targets of opportunity due to 10/10 cloud at the primary, one an unknown target in the Magdeburg area and another an artillery testing range in the same general area.

- c. One A/C was hit by flak and caught fire. Did not bomb target but jettisoned bombs after leaving target. Another aircraft released accidentally at the IP.
- d. Results of bombing at Bernburg were good. Damage done to assembly shop, hangars, and landing ground. In addition, several aprons adjacent to hangars were cratered as well as other facilities being damaged. Results at Oschersleben were good. MPI's were covered and damage was done to perimeter strips and buildings. Results at Magdeburg were good - hits in business and residential areas, dock areas and built-up areas around river. Results at Aschersleben were fair to good with hits on and around area of MPI. Results at Gardelegen were very good - hits on hangars, perimeter strips and landing ground. Results at Stendal were good - hits on landing ground, perimeter strips and hangars. Results at Obisfelde-Kaltendorf M/Y were very good, hits in M/Y, on round houses and rolling stock.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

a. Targets -	Bernburg	Oschersleben
	Magdeburg	Burg A/F
	Aschersleben	Targets of Opportunity

- (1) Moderate and accurate gunfire was encountered at Bernburg consisting chiefly of predicted concentrations, although some predictor control fire was also encountered by the last Group. Eight rockets were seen to come up from the southwest corner of the A/F.
- (2) Intense and very accurate gunfire was encountered at Magdeburg. This fire took the form of predicted concentrations and fixed barrages in the target area, but some predictor control fire was encountered while Groups were leaving the target area. A number of rockets were also seen here.
- (2) Moderate and fairly accurate predictor control fire was encountered by all Groups at Aschersleben. Several rockets were also seen here.
- (4) No AA fire was encountered at Oschersleben or Burg A/F.
- (5) Moderate gunfire was encountered on route at Ijmuiden, Den Holder, Brunswick, Halberstadt, Gardelegen and Dessau.
- (6) Meager gunfire was encountered on route at Stendal A/F, Celle, Gifhorn, Salzwedel and west of Zerbst A/F.
- (7) One Group passed very close to Diepholz A/F and encountered no AA fire.
- (8) Balloons were seen flying over a railway bridge at Bad Dejnhausen.
- (9) Two A/C of the 448th Group were shot down at Bernburg at 21000 ft.
- (10) One A/C of the 44th Group was shot down at Magdeburg at 22000 ft.
- (11) One A/C of the 467th Group and one A/C of the 458th Group were shot down at Aschersleben at 22000 ft.

5. Communications.

- a. Communications channels reported satisfactory. "Window" was used as normal for RCM purposes. Two carpet-blinker aircraft were dispatched for RCM purposes. In the target area operators observed many more Wurzburg signals than they could jam. Bombing was visual but 14 H2X aircraft were dispatched for navigational purposes. Equipment difficulties were encountered in two H2X sets.

ENEMY AIRCRAFT OPPOSITION

1. NO E/A ENCOUNTERED.

ANTI-AIRCRAFT FIRE

2. FLAK WAS ENCOUNTERED ONLY ON LAST PORTION OF BOMB RUN AND OVER ASCHERSLEBEN WHERE IT WAS MODERATE TO INTENSE AND FAIRLY ACCURATE. CREWS STATE "BRIEFED-4 GUNS, MORE NEARLY 40".

3. SEVEN OF OUR A/C SUFFERED MINOR BATTLE DAMAGE.

4. TWO A/C WERE LOST. A/C 008, 755TH SQ. IS BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN LOST TO FLAK OVER ASCHERSLEBEN AT 0932. A/C 095, 754TH SQ. WAS LAST CONTACTED BY RADIO AT 1055 OVER ROTTERDAM HEADING FOR NARROW PART OF CHANNEL. NO DEFINITE INFORMATION AVAILABLE ON EITHER A/C.
