- a. Date of Mission 13 July 1944.
- b. Primary Target Saarbrucken M/Y.
- c. Secondary and Last Resort Targets Any military objective positively identified in Germany or any military objective in an occupied country not adjacent to a built-up area and a visual sighting must be made.
- d. Units Participating 2nd CBW (389th, 453rd, 445th BG).

 14th CBW (44th, 392nd, 492nd BG).

 20th CBW (93rd, 446th, 448th BG).

 95th CBW (489th, 491st BG).

 96th CBW (458th, 466th, 467th BG).

2. Marrative.

a. 366 aircraft were dispatched to attack the marshalling yards at Saarbrucken on H2X equipment, including fifteen H2X aircraft. Two Groups of P-51s provided fighter support.


b. Due to weather conditions in the base area, assembly had to be effected at an altitude of 22,000 feet. Some units encountered Lancasters returning from operations during assembly; otherwise, assembly difficulties were nil. The units departed on time and the route was flown as briefed.

c. All units attacked the assigned target on H2X equipment with unobserved results due to 10/10 cloud cover.

d. The lead Group encountered meager, very accurate predictor control "unseen" fire in the target area. All the other Groups encountered only fixed barrages which were inaccurate. Meager gunfire was encountered enroute at a few places, but none of it could be located accurately due to weather conditions. No enemy aircraft were encountered and fighter support was good. One aircraft was lost to anti-aircraft fire. Claims were nil.

- a. The assigned primary target for this mission was Saarbrucken, Germany.
- b. Fourteen Groups attacked Saarbrucken in Group formation through 10/10 cloud on H2X equipment. 2 A/C dropped 242500 GP bombs at 4847N-0630E and one A/C dropped 12x500 GP bombs on a railroad crossing at Blois, Holland.
- c. 2 A/C did not bomb due to bomb bay door malfunctions.
- d. Tabulation of bombs dropped by H2X A/C: 6 A/C 12x500 incendiary Saarbrucken 5 A/C 18x500 GP "
 2 A/C 4x2000GP "
- e. The results of bombing were unobserved due to 10/10 clouds.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

- a. The 93rd Group led the Division and encountered meager but very accurate predictor control "unseen" fire in the target area, and also a fixed barrage which was put up behind the formation. All the other Groups encountered only fixed barrages which were inaccurate, generally being too low. Some crews estimated that these barrages were approximately 5000 ft. in depth, usually ranging from about 18000 ft to 23000 ft. A number of red AA bursts were seen in the target area but no enemy fighters were encountered. A number of rockets were also seen.
- b. Meager gunfire was encountered at a few placed on route, but none of it could be located accurately on account of the weather conditions.

(1) A few balloons were observed flying from 20000 ft to 25000 ft between 5000N-0410E and 5000N-0450E. Some of these balloons were white or silver while others were black, and they resembled normal barrage balloons. At approximately 4940N-0650E about 50 small white balloons were seen at the same altitude. These balloons were round and were approximately 3 feet in diameter, and they appeared to have some object about 12 inches long hanging beneath them. A few black balloons were also seen in the target area flying at approximately 21000 ft, one of which was seen coming up from the ground during the attack.

d. Losses.

- (1) One A/C of the 448th Group was damaged by AA in the target area and did not return. This A/C was last seen heading towards Smitzerland.
- e. Anti-Aircraft Officer's Comment.
 - (1) The attack on the target took place within 11 minutes and was very concentrated. It is interesting to note that the enemy defenses were able to engage the leading Group quite accurately by predictor control "unseen" fire, which indicates that this Group received little protection from the "Chaff". However, the weight and speed of the attack plus the liberal use of "Chaff" quickly overwhelmed the defenses and forced them to revert to very inaccurate fixed barrage fire.
 - (2) It is very improbable that the balloons observed were morred to the ground. However, it is quite possible that they had some form of explosive attached to a cable hanging from them and that they were intended to act as a form of aerial minefield.

Note: (on the day after this operation the Swedish wireless reported that a foreign barrage balloon with a drum holding inflammable liquid and an explosive charge suspended from it had landed in that country).

It does not seem likely that this weapon will prove to be a serious danger during daylight operations, but they might succeed in having some measure of success during night operations. The fact that some of the balloons were painted black probably indicates that they were originally intended for use at night.

5. Communications.


a. 15 H2X aircraft were dispatched, of which only one reported H2X equipment difficulties. Other communications facilities were satisfactory.

ENEMY AIRCRAFT OPPOSITION

NO E/A ENCOUNTERED.

ANTI-AIRCRAFT FIRE

- 2. MODERATE TO INTENSE AA OF THE NOB VISUAL BARRAGE VARIETY WAS ENCOUNTERED OVER SAARBRUCKEN. A BARRAGE OF SIX INNACURRATE SMOKE ROCKETS REPORTED OVER SAARBRUCKEN. ONE CREW BELIEVES THAT PARACHTE FLARES OR BOMBS WERE RELEASED BY THEEXPLODING ROCKETS. NO AA ENCOUNTERED TO OR FROM SAARBRUCKEN.
 - 3. ONE OF OUR A/C SUFFERED MINOR BATTLE DAMAGE.

OBSERVATIONS

4. FIFTEEN TO TWENTY A/C OBSERVED AT METZ A/D AT 0939. THREE OF THE A/C WERE SILVER AND WERE PARKED NEAR CENTER OF THE FIELD. OTHERS WERE IN WOODS ALONG EDGES OF THE FIELD AND WERE GREEN IN COLOR.

MILITARY DUMP WITH NETWORK OF CONCRETE ROADS
OBSERVED 20 MILES WEST OF SAARBRUCKEN IN VICINITY OF SARREBOURG.

TWELVE TO FIFTEEN OIL TANKS OBSERVED IN WOODS 3 MILES SE OF SARREBOURG WITH A DUMMY AREA JUST WEST OF THE TANKS.

UP TO SIX BALLOONS OBSERVED BY VARIOUS CREWS ENROUTE FROM 3 DEGREES EAST TO THE TARGET AREA FROM 0755 TO
1040. SOME WERE BLACK, SOME SILVER; SOME WERE OF THE BARRAGE
SIZE, SOME SMALLER. THE ALTITUDE OF THE BALLOONS RANGED
FROM 20-TO 25000 FEET AND THEY WERE APPARANTLU UNANCHORED
SINCE A FORMATION PASSED DIRECTLY UNDER ONE BALLOON.
