Three thousand pints of whole blood are used every day. In order to supply this blood it is essential that every healthy soldier who is not a member of a combat crew and who has twoe "O" blood volunteer to be a donor.

Giving blood, if not oftener than once every three months, is not harmful.

If you are type "O" simply put your initials by your name which will be posted on your bulletin board, as an indication that you are willing to be a donor. You will be called at the proper time.
