

In compliance with the basic communication the following information is submitted: On 2 March 1944 2nd Lt Paul K Seaman, O-904197 received fatal injuries in a take off accident of B-24-H #4128669 near Norwich, Norfolk County, England. The probable cause of the accident was due to insufficient air speed. Possibility of ice on the wings contributing to the accident. The weather was clear and visibility unlimited. The mission was combat.
