1700. (7). FROM EASTERN (1653). Crashed aircraft report. At 1632 bomber crashed at HASTINGS AVENUE, HELLESDON, G.669301. Damage to houses and civilian casualties. NORWICH CITY asked to assist. U.S.A.A.F., N.F.S. and POLICE informed. Repeated to Police 1701.

SHEPPARD has gone to incident. Unable to contact Relieving Officer i/c. Rest Centre or Deputy. Gave instructions for EASTERN to contact MRS. COLLINS, leader of Rest ^{CENTRE} Personnel, and be prepared to open Centre.
